Pharmacy First

Pharmacists can give you advice on a range of conditions and suggest medicines that can help.

They may also be able to offer treatment and prescription medicines for some conditions without you needing to see a GP (this is called Pharmacy First). Conditions they can treat as part of Pharmacy First are:

- earache (aged 1 to 17 years)
- impetigo (aged 1 year and over)
- infected insect bites (aged 1 year and over)
- shingles (aged 18 years and over)
- sinusitis (aged 12 years and over)
- sore throat (aged 5 years and over)
- urinary tract infections or UTIs (women aged 16 to 64 years)

If you go to a Pharmacy with one of these conditions the pharmacist will offer you advice, treatment or refer you to a GP or other healthcare professional if needed.

If you are not within these age ranges, a pharmacist can still offer advice, but you may need to see a GP for treatment.

Spring Covid Booster

In Spring 2024, the NHS will be launching its Covid Booster Programme. Vaccines will be offered to:

- adults aged 75 years and over
- residents in a care home for older adults
- individuals aged 6 months and over who are immunosuppressed

Hay Fever

Hay fever is usually worse between late March and September, especially when it's warm, humid and windy. This is when the pollen count is at its heights.

Symptoms of hay fever include:

- sneezing and coughing
- a runny or blocked nose
- itchy, red or watery eyes
- itchy throat, mouth, nose and ears
- loss of smell
- pain around your temples and forehead
- headache
- earache
- feeling tired
- if you have asthma, you might also:
- have a tight feeling in your chest
- be short of breath
- wheeze and cough

Hay fever will last for weeks or months, unlike a cold, which usually goes away after 1 - 2 weeks.

There are lots of treatment options with many of them available overthe-counter. If you are a sufferer, ask your local Pharmacist for advice about self treatment before seeing the doctor.
